Nicos Severis Cyprus Junior Open Championships 2026

GENERAL CONDITIONS

1. ELIGIBILITY

Entries for the **Nicos Severis Cyprus Junior Opens** (henceforth called the Championships) to be played between Monday, 16 February 2026 and Wednesday, 18 February 2026, will be accepted from players (boys and girls) who have not reached the age of 21 years old on Registration day (born on or after 16 February 2005). The Tournament Committee reserves the right to accept or refuse, or having accepted, to subsequently reject any entry without giving reason for its decision which shall be final. It also reserves the right to confirm the date of birth of a player either before or during the tournament and to disqualify any competitor making a false statement on their entry form.

2. AGE CATEGORIES & HANDICAP LIMITS

Under-16* Category: valid maximum WHS Handicap Index of 28.0 for boys and 36.0 for girls

Under-18* Category: valid maximum WHS Handicap Index of 24.0 for boys and 28.0 for girls

Under-21* Category: valid maximum WHS Handicap Index of 18.0 for boys and 24.0 for girls

* Must not be over that age as of 15 February 2026

Nations Cup: Countries/Federations represented by 3 or more players (boys and/or girls) in any age category will participate in the Nations Cup with the best 3 Gross scores counting.

At Registration, entrants must produce proof of current handicap issued by a WHS Handicap Authority within 5 days of the competition start date, i.e. certified on or after February 11, 2026.

3. FORM OF PLAY

The Championships will be decided by Stroke Play, in a 3-day event over 54 holes, played from the White tees for boys and Yellow tees for girls. The boy and girl players with the lowest overall gross score will be the Cyprus Junior Girls Open Champion 2026, and Cyprus Junior Girls Open Champion 2026 respectively. The boy and girl players from the either the Under-16 or Under-18 categories with the lowest overall gross score will be the Nicos Severis Cyprus Junior Girls Open Champion 2026, and Nicos Severis Cyprus Junior Girls Open Champion 2026 respectively. In the event of a tie for either Championship, there will be an immediate "sudden death" play-off over hole 18, repeated if required. In the event of a tie for all other prizes, count-back procedures as per the Rules of Golf will be applied. The Championships are handicap qualifying competitions and players other than CGF members, should request CGF for a copy of their score cards for use by their home clubs for handicapping purposes. Pace of play will be monitored and slow play may be penalised at the discretion of the Course Referees.

4. Entry Applications & Fees

All applicants are required to fill-in and submit an on-line Entry Application Form (EAF) found on the CGF's website, https://www.cgf.org.cy, not later than **Monday**, **February 9**, **2026**. Acknowledgement of receipt of the EAF does not constitute entry to play, and no credit card processing takes place at this stage. Successful applicants will be notified and sent a link/QR code to process their own payments through JCC Smart, our local Acquirer and Credit Card processor. In the event of the tournament being oversubscribed a waitlist will be created.

The **Entry Fee** for the Championships is €100 and includes 4 rounds of golf (practice round and 3 competition days), giveaways, practice balls on competition days, daily snacks on completion of Rounds 1 and 2, prizes and a Closing Ceremony/Prize giving function on the final day. Additional practice rounds may be booked and preferential green fees will apply. In the event of withdrawal after the closing date for entry, the entry fee will not be refunded.

5. Buggies, Caddies & Trolleys

This is a walking competition and players may not use buggies or ride on any form of transportation. Exemption for players with Official Registered Disabled status will be considered exceptionally prior to the event. Electric or manual trolleys may be used. **Caddies are allowed** but must register with the Registrar on a daily basis. For rules regarding caddies refer to the document *CGF Terms of Competitions* as published on the CGF's website.

6. Spectators

With the specific exception of helping to search for a lost ball, spectators (team managers, relatives, friends, etc.) following play are prohibited from interacting with or offering advice to players. Spectators are observers only and must not walk on the fairways or in close proximity to players, must not communicate in any manner with them or interfere with any officials performing their duties during the competition rounds. The penalty for a player asking for and/or receiving advice from a spectator is two strokes and the spectator shall be asked to leave the course.

7. LIVE SCORING

During play for all competition days, Live Scoring will be in operation, with scorers posted at predetermined places. Participants are required to cooperate with and assist the scorers in performing their duties.

8. Rules

The Championship will be played in accordance with the rules of golf as approved by the R & A and the Local Rules endorsed by the Tournament Committee. The Tournament Committee reserves the right to undertake random checks on conforming equipment. On-course Referees will give rulings which are final and players do not have the right of appear. The Tournament Committee is the final arbiter of all on and off course disputes.

9. REGISTRATION & STARTING TIMES

Competition Registration is mandatory and will take place at Eléa GC on the morning of Sunday, February 15 (practice round). Preliminary starting times for Day 1 will be published on the CGF's website following the closing date for Entry. The draw for Day 1 will be in handicap order with the lowest handicaps out first. Day 2 draw will be in reverse order of Day 1 (highest handicaps out first), while Day 3 will be in reverse order of classification with the leaders out last. Final starting times for Day 1 will be available and published on the CGF's website, one hour after the close of Registration, and for Day 2 and Day 3 shortly after the close of play of each day. The Tournament Committee reserves the right to fix and/or alter the starting times and to amend the regulations as necessary. All alterations and amendments will be published on the CGF's website and posted on the official notice board at the course. Players are reminded that they must complete Course Registration on arrival at Eléa GC on each day of the competition at least fifteen minutes before their tee time. Failure to start on time: Rule 5.3a will apply.

10. PRACTICE

The Championship Entry Fee includes one free practice round to be played on Sunday, February 15, 2026. Players **must book their individual times** directly with the club (email: <code>golfreservations@eleagolfclub.com</code> | Tel: +357 26 202001). Bookings for additional practice rounds at the course on previous days may also be made directly with the club, subject to tee time availability (green fees will apply). Players should note that, when playing practice rounds, the course would not necessarily be set up as for the Championship. Practice facilities (driving range etc.) at Eléa GC will be open daily prior to the first starting times and **free practice golf balls** will be provided on all competition days.

11. PRIZES

The main Championship trophies will be retained in the offices of the Cyprus Golf Federation, while each Champion will receive a "keeper" trophy. There will also be trophies for 2nd and 3rd places overall as well as trophies for each age category and gender (1st, 2nd & 3rd gross scores for each), as well as best Net score overall for each age category and gender. The best Net score overall by a CGF player will be awarded the Severis Cup (retained by CGF) and a keeper trophy.

Presentation of trophies will be on the last day at the closing ceremony. On the final day (Sunday) a competitor (boy or girl) that achieves a Hole-in-One at a designated par 3 hole will win a equiv 10,000 Travel Voucher (multiple winners share). With the exception of the prize for a Hole in One, no player may win more than one prize.

12. Mobile Telephones

The use of mobile telephones by players while on the golf course is allowed <u>only</u> as a GPS - Distance Measuring Device. Mobiles could also be used for emergency purposes or contacting on-course referees for a ruling. Any other use is <u>absolutely prohibited</u>, <u>even if in silent mode</u>. NO SMS messages are allowed during play. Breach of this Condition may result in <u>disqualification</u>.

13. LOCKERS

Club storage areas may be available; please enquire at the Eléa pro shop when booking your practice round or on registration, subject to availability.

14. MEDICAL CARE

During play, a doctor will be on call at players' own expense.
